## **Business & Economic Development (Skerkis)**

The BEDC hasn't met since the last TB meeting. That's because there hadn't been any movement on potential wastewater or drinking water systems and because our normal meeting date was Labor Day. However, a status update from the engineer for the sewer and wastewater systems is pasted below.

Back in July, we discussed completing the Preliminary Engineering Reports for a potential municipal water system and a potential municipal wastewater system for New Lebanon. The goal was to try to get everything prepared for the NYS EFC WIIA Grant submission this funding round.

However, as we proceeded with the Reports and had discussions with the Town's Bond Counsel, it is now our recommendation that this project wait until the following year's funding round. NYSEFC has several requirements for a Town to be considered to have a complete application for the WIIA Grant submission. This includes the Engineer's Report, SEQR, District Creation, and the Bond Resolution.

District Creation and the Bond Resolution have been challenging. This is in part based on two views the Town's Bond Counsel has. The first is that any bonding done for a sewer district must be passed by resolution and include the proposed system's costs as expected at the time of District Creation. The second is that the act of creating a sewer district obligates the Town to provide the sewer service. Together, these would show an extremely inflated proposed user cost and imply that the Town might need to bond for the entire project cost.

The reality is that we are working on the assumption that the Town would receive grant funds and 0% or very low-interest loans for the project. This would seriously reduce the overall project cost and therefore the costs to users. We are trying to avoid giving a false impression to potential users by finding a better, more accurate way to represent these costs.

To be clear, I agree with the Town's counsel that there is a conflict between Town Law and EFC's funding application requirements. On other projects, however, other bond counsels have simply just drafted the district creation resolutions to state that the Engineer's Report states that the typical user cost will be under some specified dollar amount and that the project will proceed if and only if the funding can be secured to

meet those costs. That way the project is contingent on the funding that they receive. The New Lebanon's bond counsel doesn't think this approach is appropriate. We also may need some additional time and preparation to ensure that the document used to petition for the creation of the sewer is done in a proper manner.

Also, you have a pending project under Town review and awaiting funding approval with the Tilden Commons mixed-use project that could have a major impact on the water and sewer systems. This project, if approved, funded, and constructed would carry a major portion of the system cost. Because this could have a major impact on the typical user cost for other properties in the system, we think it is best to have a more defined impact of that project so it can be included in our report. We assume that will be better defined in the next several months.

In addition, Peg has been able to collect some additional data regarding the water system with some further cost information on the school PFOS system. This might also have an impact on the recommended project and costs for the water system. A few more months of data collection would be probably helpful in completing the reports.

Because of all these variables and time-sensitive issues needed to ensure we have a complete application for the EFC WIIA Grant, and to ensure we are proposing a project that will be affordable to the users of the system, we think it would be best to wait to finalize the SEQR process and the Preliminary Engineer's Reports till December 2025 and prepare for a 2026 NYSEFC funding submission. At that time, we also could apply to the NYSDEC WQIP Grant (wastewater only) for possibly additional funding.

## **CAC, Climate Smart & Environmental Management (Powers)**

### **CAC:**

**Drinking Water Source Protection Plan (DWSP2)** -- The CAC will go out again to test in September. **RESIDENTS! Please reach out if you want your water tested for free** courtesy of the Town. Testing is 100% voluntary. If you cannot test on the upcoming date, you will be kept on the list and will keep getting contacted for your availability. Along with the testing, we are interested in information on any concerns, like things that have been buried or dumped uphill/upstream from wells. On social media, we have read about many issues that residents bring up about water - PLEASE REACH OUT TO US AND WE CAN LIKELY HELP. Knowledge is power. Many common issues are easily remediated. Please e-mail [nlcac.munves@gmail.com](mailto:nlcac.munves@gmail.com) to get on the water testing list or to share concerns.

**(DWSP2 Related) Resolution to Prevent or Stop Spread of Wastewater Sludge with PFAS** -- The CAC is presenting a draft resolution for today's meeting. This is to ask the Town Board to enact a Townwide moratorium to stop the application of sewage sludge from wastewater treatment plants onto farmland and other open spaces. (SEE ATTACHED DRAFT RESOLUTION and INFORMATION PAGE). New Lebanon, along

with other NYS towns and counties, is calling for a statewide 5 year moratorium to stop the application of sludge.

**Trees for Tribs** -- The plants are doing very well and many tubes are off of shrubs and some trees. We are mulching and fixing. Today's meeting will likely have an update from Councilmember Amlaw and us about next steps, working with some arborists. The CAC is working with a local botanist who has ample experience on public lands and parks with stream repair and strengthening eroded banks. NOTE: If anyone sees tubes bent and trees down please reach out to the Town Clerk or contact [nlcac.munves@gmail.com](mailto:nlcac.munves@gmail.com)

**Shatford Park Streambank Erosion Mitigation** -- The project is too small for DEC to come in to remediate, but we are working on a plan to have multiple access to the stream while using stones and plants to limit stream access in places where the bank is steeply eroded. We are leaning away from adding rocks and ripwrap but will have more of a plan in the coming months.

**Joint BEDC and Conservation Advisory Council Wastewater Feasibility Study** -- Our engineer Brendon Becker is submitting a letter to the Town Board about the status of the project. The Committee is in full agreement that due to unforeseen legal complications that have to be resolved that the project is postponed until next year. This is a very large undertaking with many moving pieces and we need to do our utmost to bring a good plan and solid information to the residents who may be in the district/districts.

**Hudson Valley Pattern for Progress** -- We look forward to the Aug 26 Community Meeting and completing our task of looking at all the strategies/sites that we discussed during the May 22 meeting and then carefully whittling them down.

**CAC and NL Planning Board** -- The CAC continues to attend the Planning Board (and ZBA) meetings on the private Tilden Project. Note that we are not advising the Planning Board but are raising questions and issues we would like to see addressed. The project is still evolving and responding to requests from the Planning Board.

**CSC:**

At the Town Clean Up day on Saturday, the CSC will turn in to our electronics vendor another 55 lbs of batteries that residents deposited at one of our 5 collection boxes around town. This brings the total to 1356 lbs recycled since the start of our efforts in 2021. In our next update we will detail how many pounds of electronics were turned in for recycling on Clean Up Day.

At the Town Board meeting on Sept 9th the CSC is asking the Town Board to approve, by resolution, the Hazard Mitigation Plan (HMP) that CSC, CAC, Planning Board, LVPA members, Supervisor Houghtling and members of the public gave input on over the last

few years. The template for the HMP was prepared by a consultant hired by Columbia County and the final plan has been approved by NYS Division of Homeland Security and Emergency Services and tentatively by FEMA. Once the resolution is passed by the Town and submitted to FEMA, the Town will be eligible for FEMA funding should there be any natural disasters happening in town.

## **Comprehensive Plan/Zoning Re-write Committee (Powers)**

The ZRC is focused on the update to the Comprehensive Plan. Over the last two meetings, the committee developed an overall strategy for obtaining community input into the planning process. Committee members are drafting a community survey, having used AI to suggest model questions relevant to a comprehensive plan. We are working through the means to administer the survey, including on-line, hard copy, interviews or some combination. Upon completion of the survey process, committee members will conduct in-person follow-up sessions with established community groups. Committee members are also combing through the 2021 Plan Update to identify content that needs to be updated, given the five intervening years, as well as review the 2021 Action Plan and other stated goals and priorities to determine what has been accomplished and what non-accomplished items are still valid and need to be continued into the current plan.

Your Board is aware that it was necessary to re-open the public hearing for the updated telecommunications code. I can't stress enough that the changes are technical; there are no substantive changes related to facility placement or area and bulk requirements.

Your Board is also aware that the Mt. Lebanon Historic District project will not be brought to you for approval until a series of issues identified by the public are resolved. The ZRC will continue to provide technical support and participate on the working group, however, its involvement will be modest until the Shaker Preservation Committee reaches consensus on goals and other various approaches to achieving those goals and that other priorities of ZRC members, including the comprehensive planning process, are well underway.
